

Monthly Meeting
West Caln Supervisors
Monday May 11, 2015

The regular monthly meeting of the West Caln Township Board of Supervisors was held on Monday May 11, 2015 at 7:00 P.M. in the Township Municipal Building. Present were Supervisors, Martz and Pfitzenmeyer, Police Chief Martinez, Solicitor Venzie, Road Forman Touchton, Fire Marshal Peters, Ass't Manager Russell, and Manager/Secretary Dunlap. There were 15 citizens in attendance.

Chairman Pfitzenmeyer opened the meeting and lead in the salute to the flag. The following business was then conducted.

1. Citizen Comments.

- A. Mr. John Haines requested that an additional Yard Sale be added to the Park Schedule.
- B. Mr. Clair Pyle inquired as to why the Martin's Corner Fire Hall was being sold rather than returned to the citizens of West Caln after they merged with Keystone Valley Fire Dept. Mr. Pfitzenmeyer advised him that this was do to a Charter change to allow them to give their assets to any non-profit organization.

2. Treasurer's Report.

Treasurer Russell presented the Treasurer's Report for April 2015. Mr. Martz moved to approve the report as read. Second, Mr. Pfitzenmeyer. Questions, none. Vote was 2-0 in favor.

3. Supervisor's Minutes, April 13 and 27, 2015.

Mr. Pfitzenmeyer moved to approve the minutes as prepared by Ms. Russell. Second, Mr. Martz. Questions, none. Vote was 2-0 in favor of the motion.

4. Police Report for April 2015.

Chief Martinez reported that the Department worked at total 1244 hrs., traveled 7,889.5 miles, answered 752 complaints, investigated 9 accidents, and made 44 arrests.

5. Manager's Report.

Mr. Dunlap reported that Township Engineer Ted Gacomis inspected the storm water facilities at the Cedar Craft site, and that he forwarded a letter with his recommendations. Mr. Dunlap will deliver the letter to the owner.

6. Fire and Ambulance.

Wagontown Fire Co. Deputy Chief Mike Reber reported that the company responded to 34 calls during the month, of which, 24 were in West Caln, 3 in West Brandywine and 7 in other municipalities. John Sly reported that the Westwood Ambulance responded to 95 calls during the month, 43 in West Brandywine, 35 in West Caln, and the balance in other municipalities.

7. Codes/Fire Marshal.

Mr. Dunlap reported that 6 Building Permits and 5 Zoning Permits were issued during the month. Mr. Peters gave his monthly report.

8. Road Department.

Road Forman Touchton presented his monthly report which included mowing road banks and patching. A copy of the report is on file.

9. Parks.

Gerald Patton reported that the new mower has been delivered and is in service. He further reported that Banner Advertising is doing well.

10. Historical Commission. Little to report.

11. Old Business. None.

12. New Business.

A. A quote in the amount of \$18,325.00 was received from E. M. Katz, Inc. to replace the Dump Body on Truck 2 through COSTARS. Mr. Pfitzenmeyer moved to accept the quote. Second, Mr. Martz. Questions, none. Vote was 2-0 in favor.

B. Mr. Pfitzenmeyer moved to send a letter of support to the County Parks for a grant application to obtain funds to purchase the Robert's Property just across the Brandywine Creek in West Brandywine. Second, Mr. Martz. Questions, none. Vote 2-0 in favor.

13. Solicitor's Comments. None.
